Note: Several states, including Delaware, Maine, Michigan, New Jersey, North Carolina, and Ohio, also provide for some form of reimbursement for clinical trials, but the arrangements in these states fall outside the scope of the State Cancer Legislative Database protocols.

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- ¹ Indicated insurers are only obligated to provide coverage for covered patient costs that are directly associated with the clinical trial.
- ² Coverage requirement applies only to routine patient care costs related to cancer clinical trials having a therapeutic purpose, upon recommendation by a treating physician.
- ³ Indicated insurers must provide coverage for routine patient care costs associated with a cancer trial, in certain circumstances.
- ⁴ Coverage requirement applies only to routine patient care costs incurred in connection with clinical trials for the treatment of children's cancer.
- ⁵ Coverage for Phase I and Phase II clinical trials is decided on a case-by-case basis.
- ⁶ This law extends the expiration date of coverage (noted in S.B. 240, c. 27) to 7-1-09.
- ⁷ An expiration date of 12-31-96 subsequently was deleted by S.B. 2392, c. 96-335 (1996).
- ⁸ An expiration date of 12-31-99 subsequently was deleted by S.B. 245, c. 134 (1999).
- ⁹ Requires the Department of Banking, Insurance, Securities, and Health Care Administration to issue regulations that specify the requirements for coverage of routine costs for patients who participate in approved cancer clinical trials conducted by specified providers. Coverage requirements are included in Regulation H-2001-04. (H.B. 255 originally provided that coverage would commence on 3-1-02 and continue for three years. The three-year period was subsequently deleted by H.B. 6 (2005)).
- ¹⁰ Treatment in a Phase I clinical trial may be covered on a case-by-case basis.
