

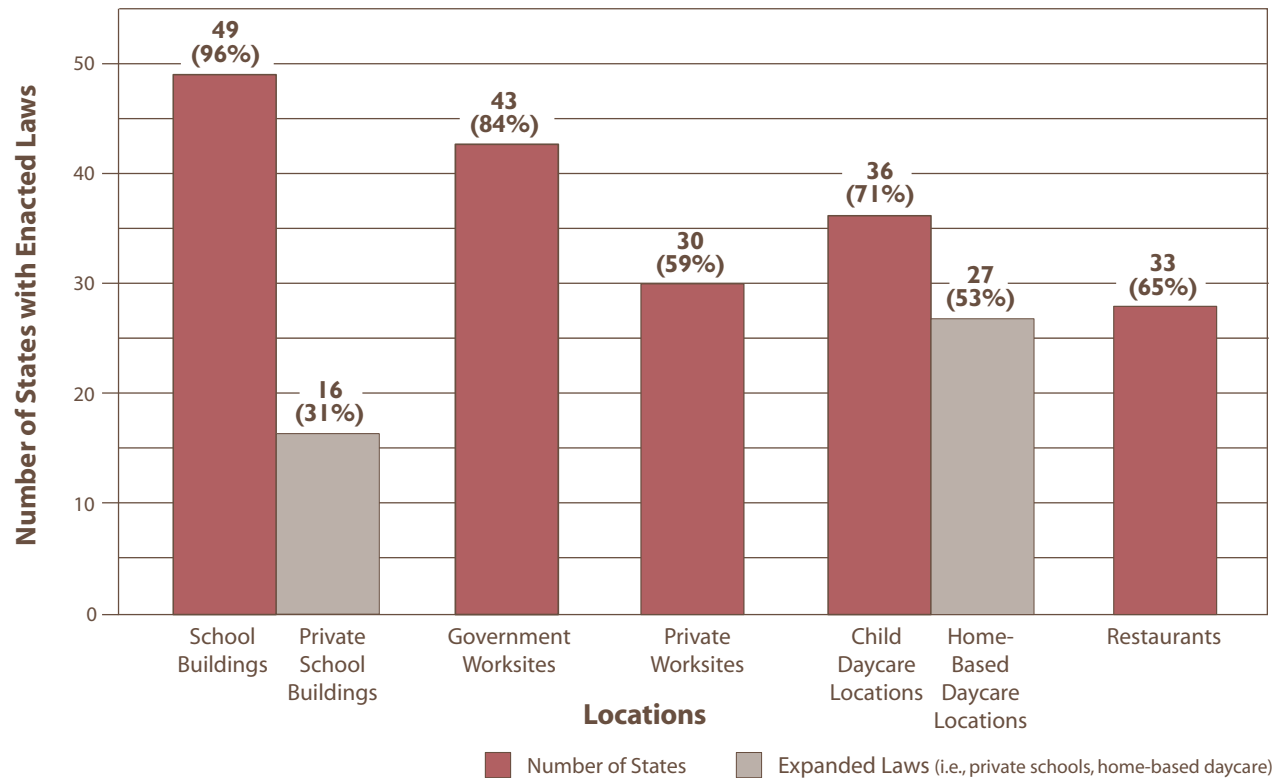

Number of States with Clean Indoor Air Laws for Specified Locations

(as of June 30, 2005)



With the exception of **Wyoming**, all states and the **District of Columbia** have enacted legislation restricting smoking in public places such as school buildings, government and private worksites, child daycare centers, and restaurants. In addition to mandating smoking restrictions or prohibitions, these laws may also address sign posting, ventilation, or penalties.

Forty-nine states (96 percent) have approved some form of clean indoor air law affecting public schools. Of those states, 16 (31 percent) explicitly apply smoking restrictions to private schools. State laws on smoking in government worksites have been enacted in 43 states (84 percent);

30 states (59 percent) have enacted clean indoor air measures for private worksites.

Laws in 36 states (71 percent) address child daycare centers; in 27 (53 percent) of these states, this legislation specifically includes home-based daycare. Thirty-three states (65 percent) have laws pertaining to clean indoor air in restaurants.

The State Cancer Legislative Database (SCLD) contains information synthesized from state-level laws. The SCLD does not contain state-level regulations; executive orders; measures implemented by counties, cities, or other localities; case law; Attorneys General opinions; or data addressing the implementation of state laws—all of which may vary significantly from the laws reported herein.
